- Most grade 11 students will have 24 to 30 credits by June 2023
- In grade 12 there are 3 compulsory courses leaving room for 7 electives
- Grade 12 students must have a minimum of 3 courses per semester

## Compulsory Courses - More Information

## English Literature - ELL

- Designed to prepare students for post-secondary education
- School will be shifting expectations of students in this course:
- Higher expectations for the workload a student will need to manage, the level of difficulty of the work they will be assigned, and the student's ability to manage their work independently.
- Grade 11 ELL30S will be required to register for Grade 12 ELL40S **
- Low marks in ELL30S will lead to recommendations to take other G12 English courses


## Health \& Phys Ed - HEPE

- Everyone needs to choose either HEPE FIT or HEPE GAMES
- An Independent HEPE, based outside the classroom, may be made available later this spring, depending on registration and staffing
- Application based - students must show they are able to complete the requirements through an application
- G12 students will have first priority, G11 students may not be eligible

Consider taking a second English course if you are concerned about your marks for university applications.

## RRTVA - What You Should Know



- Programs take a full semester
- The opposite semester will be used for compulsory courses
- Programs begin at 9:30 am and end around $2: 30 \mathrm{pm}$
- You will be back at W.C. Miller in time for bussing home
$403 \cdot$ Most RRTVA programs allow you to earn 4 credits over the semester

- If your program is at a different site, buses leave W.C. Miller around 9:00 am and return around $3: 15 \mathrm{pm}$

## Use High School to Prepare Yourself

- Take a variety of courses...go beyond the minimum
- Challenge yourself to learn from your mistakes - now is the time to take some risks

## Planning for Post Secondary Education

## Plan your Courses at Registration

Look at university/college requirements, both for admission and for scholarships, to help guide your high school course registration

- If you have a definite plan...check out the requirements from schools with your program of interest
- If you want to keep your options open...aim to meet the general requirements of the U of M and U of W


## Planning for Post Secondary Education Plan your Courses at Registration

General rules to follow for university/college preparation and eligibility

- Complete all general high school graduation requirements
- Take at least 5 full credits at the Grade 12 level
$>$ Grade 12 Health \& Phys Ed does not generally count
$>$ Don't take less than three courses in a semester and....


## Planning for Post Secondary Education

## Plan your Courses at Registration

Look Ahead - See what is required for programs you might be interested in studying

- Is a specific math course required? Does it have a minimum grade higher than $50 \%$ ?
- Are specific science courses required (Chemistry, Biology, Physics)?
- What courses do you need to be
$>$ accepted (admission)
$>$ eligible for scholarships
